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Steps to Protect Yourself from the Equifax Breach

On September 7, credit reporting entity Equifax announced a data breach that may have impacted up to 143 million people. Equifax has established a dedicated website to help consumers determine if their information was potentially compromised. The address for this website is www.equifaxsecurity2017.com. Consumers can also contact the Equifax call center at 866-447-7559 for assistance. Their call center is open every day (including weekends) from 7:00 a.m. – 1:00 a.m. eastern time.

- Monitor credit reports regularly. Credit reports are available from each of the three
 credit bureaus once a year at no charge. Everyone with credit should monitor these
 reports for suspicious activity throughout the year.
- Monitor your credit card and bank statements diligently and report any potential fraudulent charges to the card issuer immediately.
- Consider placing a Fraud Alert or Credit Freeze on your credit files. If you would like the

- Be on the lookout for phishing emails or phone calls claiming they are relative to this
 incident that attempt to get you to click on links, open attachments, or provide any
